Issue # 6 - "It's a Wrecking Ball"

Topic - Is the government being destroyed?

On January 20, 2025 one of the first things Trump did was to establish a new government "department" identified as "The Department of Government Efficiency". He appointed Elon Musk to run the program. Musk stated that he would *"reduce government spending by one trillion dollars* (\$1,000,000,000)."

When you are running a large company with multiple manufactured products or services and want to reduce costs there is more than one way to accomplish it.

First option:

- Carefully review each part of the company.
- Identify where the costs are too high.
- Determine what items or functions can be revised, reduced or replaced that will result in savings.
- Evaluate each step, determining how the change will affect your customers, suppliers and employees.
- If the changes will negatively affect others, alert them ahead of time so provision can be made to minimise problems.
- Make the changes, being careful not to disturb the general operation of other parts of your company.

Second option - Ths company owner could:

• Fire department leaders who the owner does not agree with.

- Slam the doors shut on the entire company, creating chaos for customers and suppliers.
- Send termination notices to anyone recently hired, stating that they are fired because of "performance" issues, even though many have already been given high performance reports.
- Fire multiple crucial leaders of the organization who are tasked with fighting waste and fraud without giving required 30 day notice and providing performance reasons to the board of directors.
- Close down or minimise functions that protect customers and suppliers against fraud, financial mismanagement and corruption.

The following items refer to various government departments, including mission statements and news comments about what Trump / Musk are doing.

In The News

Mission statement - Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE)

Jan 20, $2025 \cdot Our$ mission is to decentralize the narrative around government spending, giving power back to the people to hold government entities accountable for their financial decisions.

Perhaps the term *"if the bureaucracy is in charge"* could actually be better substituted with *"if DOGE / Musk is in charge"*, what meaning does democracy actually have?.

Let's take a tour of some of the government departments subject to recent attacks by Trump / DOGE / Musk activities.

USAID

Mission Statement - usaid.gov

We partner to end extreme poverty and promote resilient, democratic societies while advancing our security and prosperity.

Factcheck.org

On Feb 1 DOGE did this to USAID:

"The agency's website was taken down, and on Feb. 7, it showed a notice that said: "On Friday, February 7, 2025, at 11:59 pm (EST) all USAID direct hire personnel will be placed on administrative leave globally, with the exception of designated personnel responsible for mission-critical functions, core leadership and specially designated programs."

"USAID is a criminal organization," Musk wrote on his social media platform, X, on Feb. 2. "Time for it to die."

We arm people with the information, steps, and tools that they need to make smart financial decisions.

The CFPB has told staffers to "not perform any work tasks" while it <u>shuts down its DC</u> <u>headquarters</u> amid an uncertain future.

The agency followed up by sending termination notices to dozens of employees, some of whom had already accepted the buyout offer, sources familiar with the situation <u>told</u> <u>CNBC</u>.

Office of ethics

Mission statement - oge.gov

The United States Office of Government Ethics (OGE) leads and oversees the executive branch ethics program which is at work every day in more than 140 agencies. The executive branch ethics program works to prevent financial conflicts of interest to help ensure government decisions are made free from personal financial bias.

OGE leads and oversees the executive branch ethics program by:

- Making and interpreting ethics laws and regulations.
- Supporting and training executive branch ethics officials.
- Administering the executive branch financial disclosure systems.
- Monitoring senior leaders' compliance with ethics commitments.
- Ensuring agencies comply with ethics program requirements.
- Making ethics information available to the public.

"President Donald Trump fired multiple inspectors general late on Friday, removing the independent watchdogs tasked with investigating abuse and impropriety in federal agencies in a move that potentially violates federal law.

Right off the bat, the obvious problem with such a move is the apparent motivation: Inspectors general are responsible for investigating internal wrongdoing, possible ethical lapses, alleged corruption and fraud, and mismanagement."

IRS

IRS mission Statement - irs.gov

Provide America's taxpayers top quality service by helping them understand and meet their tax responsibilities and enforce the law with integrity and fairness to all.

This mission statement describes our role and the public's expectation about how we should perform that role.

- In the United States, the Congress passes tax laws and requires taxpayers to comply.
- The taxpayer's role is to understand and meet his or her tax obligations.
- The IRS role is to help the large majority of compliant taxpayers with the tax law, while ensuring that the minority who are unwilling to comply pay their fair share.

Two sources familiar with the IRS's plans told The Associated Press that the agency is expected to lay off thousands of probationary workers in the middle of tax season.

Some accountants <u>say that a personnel shortage</u> could mean long wait times for taxpayers seeking help with their returns and significant delays for tax refund checks.
